


President's Message

- Q: What is with all the long grass just off the course? Keep losing my ball if it goes an inch off the course.
- A: The maintenance crew is waiting to purchase new machines that will handle cutting this grass in a more efficient manner. In the meantime I suggest trying to keep your shots on the fairway to avoid losing any more balls.
- Q: When are the new cart sheds going to be done?
- A: We have been told the completion date is December 1st. Please see page 4 of this newsletter for more details on how they will be distributed.
- Q: I am interested in helping out with the RHGC. How do I become a Board member?
- A: Elections for RHGC Executive Director positions will occur in November. The election for Board Executive positions are divided into two groups in order to ensure a smooth transition between Board members. This year the positions that members can run for are President, Treasurer, and Handicap Director. Each of the Executive Board members serve a 2 year term. Board Executive members are not allowed to run for consecutive Board Executive positions. There are also 8 yearly appointed Board members: Membership Director, Youth Golf Director, Pro Shop Director, Grounds and Rules Director, Clubhouse Director, Ladies Golf Director, Social Director, and Media Director. Appointed Board members are selected each January by the RHGC Board Executive.

New Cart Sheds

Finally, the long wait is over. After years of anticipation (for some more than a decade), the new golf cart shed construction is near completion. These golf cart sheds are being made available to RHGC members based on the order of a wait-list that has been maintained by the club. The list does not necessarily correspond to the join date of the member (historically, there were a number of factors that affected a member's place on the list; opt-in date, uninterrupted on-time payment of dues and green fees, change employment status, etc.). Updated wait-lists have been made available for membership viewing over the years so there should be no great surprise on the order (a few changes were made based of supporting evidence provided). Special appeals can be submitted to the Membership Director (patrick.antony@aramco.com) along with the proper documentation and description of circumstances until October 14. Decisions are made by the membership director, in consultation with the board, and based on precedent with significant weight placed on established club policies and existing practices.



In total, 108 new golf cart sheds were built and it is expected that 106 sheds will be made available (two sheds will contain a series of rented lockers for off-camp members to store their golf bag/clubs). The corresponding number of



106 members on the top of the wait-list will be guaranteed a new 'valley' golf cart shed. If a selected member declines in the hopes of getting one of the original 'hill' golf cart shed, he/she will be bypassed and the next member on the list will be offered the shed. The passed over member will retain the same top spot on the list and later offered an original shed when it becomes available.

The assignments of the new golf cart sheds will be conducted as a social (fun)-raiser. For those lucky 106 members wishing for a particular location or lucky shed number, we will be accepting bids and having a live auction in early December when the sheds are expected to be completed. The highest bid will have the option of selecting first, second high-

est next and so on. Only those selected 106 will be guaranteed a shed and allowed to bid. If a shed does not receive a bid, the membership director will make the shed assignment.

- October 14: close appeal process
- · October 15: freeze golf cart shed wait-list order
- October 15: inform top 106 members of their selection and solicit their intent of accepting
- October 22: finalize the lucky 106 members
- December 1 2: tour of sheds "open house"
- December 3 7: accept submittal of silent bids (for those unable to attend the live auction event must designate specific shed; only one silent bid is allowed).
- December 10: live auction at club house. Hand over keys!!!

All monies raised will go toward club social events, youth golf programs, maintenance crew appreciation, etc..







Handicap Corner

MEMBERS IN HANDICAP PROGRAM SHOULD ENTER "ADJUSTED GROSS SCORES"

If you are participating in the Handicap Program to maintain a USGA <u>handicap index</u>, you must apply Equitable Stroke Control adjustments when entering your score for handicap purposes.

WHAT IS EQUITABLE STROKE CONTROL?

Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) is a feature of the USGA Handicap System whereby abnormally high individual hole scores are adjusted downward prior to the score being posted. ESC sets a maximum number that a golfer can post on any hole based on Course Handicap (not Handicap Index). See table below.

EQUITABLE STROKE CONTROL

COURSE HANDICAP	MAXIMUM NUMBER ON ANY HOL							
9 or less	Double Bogey							
10 through 19	7							
20 through 29	8							
30 through 39	9							
40 or more	10							

HOW TO DETERMINE YOUR POSTING SCORE

The score that you post should be your "adjusted gross score" that accounts for Equitable Stroke Control. For example, on that one hole per round where you put multiple balls in the water and then 4-putt, you might have taken 12 strokes to get the ball in the cup. But based on your course handicap, ESC might require you to enter only a "7" on the scorecard you post. Including that 12 on your handicap score might throw your handicap index out of whack. Remember, the handicap index is not meant to reflect your average score, it's meant to reflect your best potential.

ENTERING YOUR SCORES

There are 2 ways to enter your scores:

SINGLE ENTRY – enter total score for the round, using one of the following:

- GHIN website http://www.ghin.com/scorePosting.aspx using the "Post Scores" link
- GHIN app on your phone
- Through Foretees with the "Post a Score" link under the "Handicaps" menu.

When a member enters their total score for the round, he/she MUST take into account the maximum score that can be recorded per hole. e.g. REDUCE the score on "blow up" holes as shown below. You should be using the numbers in RED when you calculate your total score.

In the examples above, the adjusted gross score entered would be 134, 122, 109, 85 and 79 (not 140, 130, 114, 88 or 81).

HOLE-BY-HOLE in GHIN (this is preferable method).

With an eGolfer profile you can log into GHIN and enter your scores hole-by-hole and the system automatically does the ESC adjustment for you.

Why is ESC important? If you do not account for maximum score adjustments, your scores entered and handicap index may be inflated. This would not be in compliance with USGA handicap policy and would not be fair to other golfers who you compete against who are applying these maximum scores correctly. So, before you enter your score for handicap purposes, make sure to apply the ESC maximum scores based on your course handicap. It is your responsibility.
