A Junior Tour School will commence on Saturday March 10th and will last for 5 weeks. The clinic will cover the fundamentals and basics (putting, irons, chipping, and woods) of the game and swing. All equipment and range balls will be supplied. Numbers are limited—only children aged 8 – 16 are permitted to take part in a Junior Clinic. The class runs for one hour each Saturday from 8:00 am – 9:00 am. The cost is 400 SAR and needs to be paid prior to the class commencing.

Stuart will be running the next "Golf in a Week" class starting on Sunday, March 25th. Classes are an hour each day beginning at 7:00 pm. This is a 5 consecutive day course aimed at beginner and intermediate golfers. It covers all aspects of the game: Safety, Rules, Etiquette, Swing Method, and an on course Texas scramble. All equipment and range balls are supplied. The cost is 600 SAR. Please sign up in the Pro Shop.

Stuart offers a Ladies only class each Thursday morning from 9-10 AM. All equipment is supplied and there is free coffee on arrival. It is ideal for either the beginner or intermediate golfer as it covers all the skills to get one out on the course! The cost is 90 SAR per person per class.

Ask Carl

- Q: I was playing in the CEO Cup and I told someone in my group the distance his ball was from the pin. Another person in our group said I was not allow do to do so because I am not allowed to give advice. Is that correct?
- A: It is correct that you are not allowed to give advice, but the distance a ball is from the hole is not advice. General information is not considered advice. Telling someone the position of bunkers, location of the flagstick, a rule of golf, or the line of play on a blind shot are not considered giving advice. Here are some examples of giving advice. The first part is OK. The second part is not.
 - "You are 150 yards out, I would hit an 8 iron"
 - "You have a 1 foot putt, take your time"
 - "You can choose to hit the ball from the cart path or take a free drop. Take the drop"
 - "There is a bunker in front of the green. Better club up"
- Q: Now that the new cart sheds have been given out, how can I find where I am on the waiting list?
- A: Check the RHGC website. A new list has been published.

RHGC Handicap Program

Participation in the Handicap Program is completely voluntary.

If you are not participating and would like to, you must agree to abide by the responsibilities listed below, then contact the Handicap Director and opt in.

If you are participating and would like to stop, also please contact the Handicap Director.

The reason for the Club's Handicap Program is to provide USGA certified handicaps which will in turn provide a level playing field for all participants in all club-sponsored events. These handicaps will also enable members to play in any USGA sanctioned- event worldwide. RHGC uses the USGA "GHIN" software to administer handicaps.

The responsibilities of all members using this service provided by the Club are:

- If a member participates in the handicap system, he/she is expected and agrees to post all scores as appropriate including rounds played at RHGC and at any other RCGA-USGA rated course. Note: Tournament scores are entered automatically, members should not post their own tournament scores.
- 2. When a member enters a gross score (other than Tournament Scores), he/she MUST take into account the maximum score that can be recorded per hole, known as Equitable Stroke Control (ESC). The table below lists the maximum strokes per hole based on the Course Handicap. Note: if you enter your gross scores hole-by-hole in GHIN, this ESC adjustment is done automatically by the software.

EQUITABLE STROKE CONTROL

COURSE HANDICAP	MAXIMUM NUMBER ON ANY HOLE
9 or less	Double Bogey
10 through 19	7
20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10

- 3. Members who are not in the Handicap System or do not have a USGA certified handicap from another source will not be allowed to enter any tournaments, leagues, or other Club-sponsored events for which a certified handicap is required.
- 4. Member's Handicaps and Recent Scores are posted after each handicap revision for Peer Review. Peer Review is essential in maintaining the integrity of the Handicap Program and is everyone's responsibility. Scores made while playing alone are no longer considered acceptable for handicap purposes, however, anyone accompanying a golfer during a round, including a caddie, would make the score acceptable.
- 5. A round of golf is a round of golf, whether a member personally chooses to designate it as just "playing for fun" or "practice" does not matter. Any round in which at least 13 holes are played should be posted as an 18-hole round for handicap purposes. Rounds of at least 7, but less than 13 holes played, should be posted as a 9-hole round. Un-played holes are entered as par plus any handicap strokes (i.e. net par).
- 6. The GHIN Handicap Software has the capability to record 9-hole scores as well as 18-hole scores. The software will automatically combine 9 holes scores (and automatically queue a 9 hole score, so there is no need to enter 9 holes scores in pairs.)
- 7. Match Play scores should be entered as well. For a conceded hole or putt, the "most likely" score should be posted. If you don't play a full 18 holes in your match, enter par plus any handicap strokes (i.e. net par) for the remaining holes.
- 8. If a member wants an unofficial "personal" handicap based on whatever scores he/she wants to selectively track, they should use one of the various Internet available services.

The Board of Directors and the Handicap Committee are totally committed to helping make your golfing experience at RHGC an enjoyable one. At the same time, we ask all members who use the handicap system to be cognizant of their individual responsibilities for using the system and for maintaining the integrity of their individual handicaps in accordance with the USGA Handicap Manual and the Club's Handicap Program. Grounds Update

Congratulations to the Rolling Hills Maintenance Staff who did a fantastic job preparing the course for the CEO Cup Tournament. The volunteers who helped marshal and keep up the pace of play did a great job as well and the Board really appreciates them taking their time to help the club.

Many of you may have heard that Jason Sexton (Rolling Hills Superintendent) has not been offered a new contract, yet. Aramco is working hard to fix issues with existing contracts that are not government compliant. Gardening and Community Services are doing their best to create a new contract and we are optimistic this will be resolved soon.

As I mentioned in the February Newsletter our top priority for 2018 is the removal of the Tamarisk "pine-weeds" that flank much of the course. The Rolling Hills Maintenance Staff and Gardening are on board with this effort and are working with the RHGC Board to prioritize the Tamarisk eradication. Holes 10 and 11 are first up and you will see progress over the next few weeks. Gardening has also agreed to purchase a "bush hog" mower that will be used to maintain the off-course area and prevent the inevitable intrusion of the Tamarisk. We also plan to line much of these areas with Cornucopia trees to further restrict the Tamarisk intrusion. It is difficult to predict the timeline for complete Tamarisk removal and for now we are thrilled to be moving in the right direction.

Another high priority is the enhancement of the driving range. We are investigating the removal of the pipeline that cuts across the range around the 75 yard area. We are also looking into the addition of distinctive greens/bunkers on the range to help gauge distance of your shots. Another idea we are exploring is the transfer of the chipping green to the driving range area and this will consolidate the Academy to a centralized area.

Clubhouse

With the raining weather, the stairs to the clubhouse are slippery. Please use the hand rails going up and down the steps.

March 27 - Monthly Medal Stroke Play


Meet at the clubhouse at 7:30. This is an 18 hole competition and you must be a member and have a valid handicap to play.
