Ask Carl

- Q: Why did someone tie the barricades by the lower cart sheds together with rope? I need to be able to open them so I can get to the hole 1 tee box when I'm running late for my 3:04 tee time.
- A: The barricades had to be tied together because people kept opening them to bypass the one and only approved entrance between the chipping green and starter shack. If you recall, one of the stipulations for RHGC reopening was that we had to control access to the course and take temperatures before allowing players to proceed. Bypassing the approved entrance and check in procedure puts the club at risk of getting closed again, and we all remember how that went back in March. If you don't have enough time to check in before your tee time, you need to either book a later tee time or leave work earlier.

Handicap Corner

How Many Greens in Regulation Should You Hit Based on Your Handicap?

As we head into the Eid Holiday, some of us will be playing a lot of golf instead of traveling like we normally do. So thought it would be fun to share an interesting article I came across recently. Happy reading

How many greens in regulation should you be hitting based on your golf handicap? Take a look at the graph below, courtesy of ShotByShot.com. For those unsure exactly what a green in regulation means, this is when you either hit the green on a par-3 with your tee shot, a par-4 in one or two shots, and a par-5 in one, two or three shots.

The GIR numbers below represent the number hit by each handicap group in the rounds when they play to their handicap...



You may be wondering how the +3 to +1 and 0-2 categories hit more greens in regulation than a PGA Tour Pro? This is down to the dramatic difference in the length of the courses played by professionals and amateurs. It also alludes to the fact Pros tend to attack more pins and go for birdies while amateurs typically learn to play to the heart of a green for more consistency.

New GHIN Handicap Index and Course Handicap Report

Starting in 2020 with the WHS, handicap indexes are automatically recalculated every day, however, it is not practical to post course handicaps daily. However, a new GHIN report has been made available, so periodically we will run this report and post it on our website. See https://www.arabiangolf.net/node/39 for the most recent report.
