(3) SAGA Clubs Project:

SAGA Clubs asked us if they could use our GHIN contact, as their GoftSoftware.com system is not WHS compliant. Elevated to Exec Board before approaching contact at USGA/TGA to ask if we can use our TGA GHIN contract. Initial response from the USGA/TGA: in order to make exception for other SAGA courses (like USGA originally did for RHGC) they would need letter from Company that these courses are part of Aramco. This was provided by RHGC President from SAGA President and sent to USGA/TGA on 8/30. TGA then followed up and requested slope/rating documentation for these courses before they escalate. **10/11 UPDATE**: Available slope/rating documentation was provided to RHGC President who is following up with SAGA courses for missing info.

(4) Special Project with Tournament Director:

Tech Rep from USGA/TGA for TM/GG system contacted me about issues he sees with how RHGC is updating master roster data in that system. Put him in contact with Jeff Meisner who has been answering their inquires. USGA/TGA has come back with some suggestions for re-engineering our process flow related to Membership, GHIN and TM/GG. Jeff is looking into some options before we propose to TGA. 10/11 UPDATE: Steve sent Jeff draft input into proposed New Member Process on September 20th.

RULES

Getting Organized: Reviewed Committee Procedures from Rules of Golf for how best to organize Rules Committee incl members. Coordinated with Grounds Director who is on Committee per updated R&R. Also will need to coordinate with Tournament Committee as Rules are organized by Casual vs Competition Play. 10/11

1 <u>UPDATE:</u> Rules Committee has voted on Oct 11th agreed changes to RHGC Local Rules, including 1) clarification of OOB markings, and two revisions 2) Any stroke played that hits a floodlight pole, must be cancelled and replayed and 3) maximum score for handicap purposes per WHS, versus the old reference to ESC which was pre 2020. These will be posted.

Course Markings

- First priority will be on this area eg, out of bounds stakes, etc. Walked course with Troy 8/31 and updated draft plan for OOB markings. 10/11 UPDATE: As Grounds makes changes to OOB markings, we will update the Local Rules, as applicable.
- Walkway being constructed next to the course boundary on hole 2: A new walk way at the other side of the hedges on Hole 2 is being constructed very close to the hedge line (like Hole 3) so Community Services will need to advise when this walkway will become operational and need to be informed of the need to install a net to cover the boundary of the course to protect walkers.
