The next "Golf in a Week" class starts on September 26th. Classes are an hour each day beginning at 7:00 pm and run for 5 consecutive days. Courses aimed at beginner and intermediate golfers. It covers all aspects of the game: Safety, Rules, Etiquette, Swing Method, and an on course Texas scramble. All equipment and range balls are supplied. The cost is 600 SAR.

Stuart offers a ladies' only class each Thursday morning from 9:00 -10:00. All equipment is supplied and there is free coffee on arrival. It is ideal for either the beginner or intermediate golfer as it covers all the skills to get one out on the course! The cost is 90 SAR per person per class.

Ask Carl

Q: On hole #9, I hit my drive into the palm trees by the bunker. It got stuck in the fronds. What is the proper what to play it?

A: Great question. This happens more than people think. However, there are a couple situations that could occur.

Situation 1 – Ball held up at the palm tree and can be seen, identified, and confirmed to be my ball but I can't retrieve the ball.

Unplayable relief would be available under situation 1 since the ball was identified. Take an unplayable with the reference point for relief being directly below the ball. One-shot penalty. See <u>19.2c/1</u>.

Situation 2 – Ball held up at the palm tree and can't be seen from below, neither can be identified nor can it be confirmed.

If the player cannot find and identify the golf ball stuck in tree within the three-minute searching period, the ball must be declared lost. Simply go back to the spot of the previous stroke, drop within 2 club lengths, no closer to the hole and play it again with one-shot penalty (Stoke & distance). If the was a tee shot, return to the teeing area.

If you would like Carl to answer a question, please email a Board member and they will make sure Carl gets it. Which is nice.

Handicap Corner

The World Handicap System (WHS) began rolling out in January 2020.

Millions of golfers from 108 countries around the world are now experiencing the benefits of the new system which is designed to be consistent, inclusive and modern. Though many countries have already adopted the new system, other countries will soon be going live to accommodate different implementation plans and variations in their golf seasons. The following is a list of countries that have implemented the WHS as of August 9, 2021 (blue in map below).

Rules Corner

Pace of Play

Rule 5.6 encourages prompt pace of play by recommending that:

- Players should recognize that their pace of play affects others and they should play promptly throughout the round (such as by preparing in advance for each stroke and moving promptly between strokes and in going to the next tee), and
- A player should make a stroke in no more than 40 seconds (and usually in less time) after the player is able to play without interference or distraction,

Here are some tips for improving pace of play:

• Start on-time: Confirm your tee time in advance and make it a point to arrive at the tee early with your golf equipment in order, ready to play.

• "Tee It Forward" unless you are consistently able to reach greens in regulation from the back tees (Blue for Men and White for Ladies). In other words, play from a set of tees that is comfortable for you – one where you are more likely to hit lofted irons into greens instead of hybrids or fairway woods. It is acceptable for players in the same group to play from different tees. (The World Handicap System provides a formula for adjusting handicaps from different tees.)

• **Try alternate forms of play to speed up your round**: Match play, Stableford, best-ball and other formats are easy and fun alternatives to individual stroke play because not every player has to hole out on every hole. There are multiple resources online and in print to learn about the many different golf formats. Try one out.

• **Minimize your time on the tee**: On the tee it is usually acceptable for players to "hit when ready." You can also save time by playing a provisional ball (<u>Rule 27-2</u>) if you think your original ball might be lost or out of bounds.

• Plan your shot before you get to your ball: Once you are off the tee, think ahead. Determine your yardage and make your club selection before it is your turn to play. Very often, you can do this while others are playing, without disruption. If you take your glove off between shots, have it back on before it is your turn to play. Even a small step like this saves time.

• **Play "Ready Golf"**, especially if you find you are out of position or just need to catch up with the group ahead of you. Rule 6.4 expressly allows playing out of turn in Match play by agreement, and for Stroke play, affirmatively allows and encourages players to play out of turn in a safe and responsible way to save time or for convenience.

• Keep your pre-shot routine short: Pick your line of play once and trust yourself. Try to take no more than one practice swing, then set up to the ball and play your shot. Most importantly, be ready to hit when it is your turn. Be efficient after your shot too. Start moving toward your next shot promptly.

• Aim to play in 20-40 seconds: From club selection to pre-shot routine to execution, strive to hit your shot in 20-40 seconds when it is your turn to play. Help keep play moving at a brisk pace.

• **Develop an eye for distance**: You don't have to step off yardage for every shot. If you need to determine precise distance, try to find a yardage marker before you reach your ball, then step off the yardage on the way to your ball. Or, consider investing in an electronic range-finder or global positioning system for golf and use it when permitted by Local Rule. If others you are playing with are not familiar with the course, the Rules permit players to exchange yardage information without penalty.

• When sharing a cart, use a buddy system: (Note: if COVID 19 Rules allows) Don't wait in the cart while your cartmate hits and then drive to your ball. Get out and walk to your ball with a few clubs. Be ready to play when it is your turn and then let your cartmate pick you up. Or, drive to your ball after you drop your cartmate off and then pick him or her up after you hit.

• Be helpful to others in your group: Follow the flight of all tee shots, not just your own. Once in the fairway, help others look for their ball if you already know the location of yours. Volunteer to fill in a divot or rake a bunker for another player if needed. Be ready to attend the flagstick for others.

• Keep up with the group in front of you: Your correct position on the course is immediately behind the group in front of you, not immediately in front of the group behind you. Arrive at your next shot just before the group in front leaves the area in front of you. If you are consistently not able to keep up and a gap opens in front of you, invite the group behind you to play through, irrespective of the number of players in the group.

• Be efficient on the putting green: Mark your ball and lift and clean it when you arrive at the putting green so you will be ready to replace it when it is your turn to play. You can usually line up your putt while others are putting, without disturbing them. Leave your clubs on the side of the putting green closest to the next tee, and leave the green promptly after holing out. Wait until the next tee to record your score.

• Remember that picking up your ball is permitted by the USGA Handicap System: If not in an individual stroke play competition, it is generally OK to pick up your ball and move on to the next hole if you are "out" of a hole and want to maintain pace of play. This applies in match play and many forms of stroke play, including Stableford and best-ball play.
