The next "Golf in a Week" class starts on October 24th. Classes are an hour each day beginning at 7:00 pm and run for 5 consecutive days. Courses aimed at beginner and intermediate golfers. Monthly Medals

There will no changes to the Membership Fee Structure from 2021


GOLF CART REGISTRATION

HANDICAP CORNER

3 Things to Know About 3 World Handicap System Safeguards



The World Handicap System includes three new safeguards that protect the integrity of your Handicap Index.

When the World Handicap System™ (WHS) was implemented in January 2020, three new safeguards designed to protect the integrity of your Handicap Index® were built into the system. Now that more golfers are seeing these features come into play, here are three things to know about each one:

Playing Conditions Calculation (PCC)

The PCC is entirely based on scoring data.

Simply put, the PCC compares the actual scores made at a given course each day to the expected scores of the players who made them. If the number of players who score at or below their expected score is higher than anticipated, the course played easier. If the number of players who score at or below their expected score is lower than anticipated, the course played more difficult. PCC adjustments are applied automatically and clearly identified within a player's scoring record.

The more scores, the better!

For the calculation to take place, at least 8 scores must be posted at a course by players with a Handicap Index of 36.0 or below – and the more scores that are posted, the more reliable the data becomes. The calculation also takes into consideration each player's Course Handicap and the Course Rating $^{\text{TM}}$ and Slope Rating $^{\text{RM}}$ of the tees that were played.

When you post matters!

The PCC takes place at the end of each day, so only scores posted on the day of play will contribute to the data pool. With that said, if you forget to post on the same day, the result of the PCC will still be applied to your score when it is posted – as long as you post it to the appropriate date. So far in 2020, 58 percent of scores have been posted on the same day – let's all do our part to increase that number!

Soft Cap and Hard Cap

It starts with your Low Handicap Index®.

A Low Handicap Index serves as the baseline for the cap procedure and is the lowest Handicap Index achieved by a player within the 365-day period preceding the most recent score in their scoring record. A player does not establish a Low Handicap Index until they have 20 scores in their scoring record.

The caps are applied automatically.

Each time your Handicap Index updates, the new value is compared to your Low Handicap Index and:

- If a 3.0 stroke increase takes place, the soft cap reduces the rate of upward movement beyond 3.0 strokes by 50 percent.
- If a 5.0 stroke increase takes place (after the soft cap is applied) the hard cap prevents any additional upward movement from taking place.

HANDICAP CORNER (CONTINUED)

3 Things to Know About 3 World Handicap System Safeguards



The Handicap Committee can override the cap – but only if necessary.

All of us as golfers experience a poor stretch from time to time – but since underlying ability does not typically change significantly over a short period, a player's Handicap Index usually works its way back toward their Low Handicap Index. However, if a player experiences an injury or illness that causes higher scores and the cap(s) to be applied, the Handicap Committee at their home club can override the cap by adjusting their Handicap Index to a level reflective of their current ability.

Exceptional Score Reduction (ESR)

1) A score that is 7.0 strokes or better than the player's Handicap Index is considered exceptional.

WHS research shows that a player who shoots an exceptional score is more likely than others to score at or below their Handicap Index in subsequent rounds. As a result, the ESR is designed to better reflect demonstrated ability and prevent a player from having an advantage.

2) The procedure is simple.

When a score is between 7.0 and 9.9 strokes better than the player's Handicap Index at the time the round was played, their Handicap Index is reduced by 1 stroke. If the score is 10.0 strokes or better, their Handicap Index is reduced by 2 strokes.

3) The impact of the ESR diminishes over time.

When an ESR takes place, a -1 or -2 adjustment is applied to the most recent 20 score differentials in the player's scoring record. However, scores made from that point forward will not include the -1 or -2 adjustment – unless they are also exceptional – which allows the ESR to work itself out of the player's scoring record over time

RULES CORNER

Golf Rule in Focus: Rule 18.2

Under Rule 18.2, the time for a ball search (before the ball becomes lost) is <u>3 minutes</u> (was 5 minutes before 2020).



Limiting the search period to 3 minutes is more consistent with the underlying principle that golf is to be played in a prompt and continuous way, without long pauses in play. In most cases, if the ball is going to be found, it will be found within the first 3 minutes.

Although this change may increase the number of lost balls, on average the overall impact should be to speed up play. Knowing that the search time is limited to 3 minutes should encourage players to play a provisional ball when they believe there is a chance their ball may not be found.



GROUNDS

Jason Sexton and the Rolling Hills maintenance crew have done a remarkable job keeping the course in top shape this year. It wasn't easy and with help from Gardening and Community Services, irrigation issues were overcome, and new machinery and chemical materials have been added to the inventory. In addition, beautification components are starting to show up along the course margins. It is clear the course is trending in the right direction and everyone should be excited for what's to come.

Now that the weather has started to turn we should be in for about 7 months of world-class playing conditions (minus the occasional shamal & rain). That means the course will undergo a lot more play than over the summer months. Knowing this, it is the responsibility of all players to adhere to the below etiquette policies:

- When you approach the green be on the lookout for ball-marks and as a general rule, you should fix your ball-mark plus 1 more. Don't be that person who sees a ball-mark and ignores it because they didn't cause it. This is probably the number one etiquette issue and the only way we can improve is by all players pushing their playing partners to follow the etiquette policy of repairing ball-marks. Did you know it can take several weeks for old ball-marks to be repaired naturally? If you take 10 seconds to fix your ball-mark it is a lot better than 2+ weeks!
- After you play out of a green-side bunker, remember to tap your shoes with your club to knock off the loose sand before walking on the green (historically this was not a big problem but we are seeing more and more of it lately; see picture below). Besides interfering with the ball while putting, the loose sand grains can wreak havoc on the expensive and high precision green mowers. The quartz grains can chip and cause irregularities to the mower blades and that means more time in the shop. If you are playing with someone who is leaving sand prints on the green, please point this out. It is such an easy solution...
- Always carry a bottle, or bag, of sand and fill your divots (try not to dump copious amounts of sand as this is unnecessary)
- Do not replace grass in your divot as it will die anyway
- Keep all golf carts a minimum of 30 ft. from the greens (see picture below)
- Do not drive golf carts between green-side bunkers and the green.
- Do not drive golf carts into water "penalty" areas (holes 3, 4, 12, 15, and 17)
- When driving to your ball, do your best to stay on the cart path, or fairway, and do your best to stay off the rough (the grass will go dormant by the end of November and it is already very difficult to play out of our rough and doubly so when carts are mashing the rough).





Finishing:

Players will earn 30 points for first place, 29 points for second place etc. with points decreasing by finishing position.

Positional ties in a given round will receive points based on the number of players tied:

• Ex. - a three-way tie for 2nd place the October or November round will result in the following points being allocated to those players:

The **overall winner** will be determined by the total number of points earned in both the October and November rounds.

If there is a tie for 1st place overall, the winner shall be determined by a Match Play sudden death playoff starting on Hole #1

• There will no handicap allowance for the Match Play playoff.
