<u>Tournament Committee</u>: Help out in planning upcoming major tournaments and discuss any circumstances surrounding the event, to ensure smooth and effective running of the tournament. Additional volunteer opportunities also include serving as roaming marshals, on-course hole marshals, supporting registration & gift distribution, and more.

Social Committee: Support in developing and planning several social events throughout the year.

Ladies' Golf Committee: Help with monthly Ladies' League events, with planning, and hosting.

<u>Jr. Golf Committee:</u> The Junior Golf Committee meets to discuss various items related to event formats, changes to the event schedule, and food/beverage options for each monthly event. Committee members also assist the day of the event with groupings, swag/food distribution, and ensuring the participants are following the course rules and etiquette.

Handicap Committee: To meet the definition of a Golf Club and remain authorized to use the World Handicap System, RHGC must have a Handicap Committee of at least three people. It is chaired by Handicap Director, and their job to ensure WHS Rules of Handicapping are followed; accurate Handicap Indexes are issued including the timely submission of acceptable scores; and to offer support and education to its members. For RHGC, committee members are used in two situations 1) where voting is needed (e.g., handicap index adjustments) or 2) assisting the Handicap Director with performing his/her required tasks, as needed or during leave.

<u>Grounds & Rules Committee:</u> This committee supports with Local Rules updates and helping answer questions arising during general play.

<u>Trophy Committee:</u> This committee manages the trophy/trophies distribution of the tournament. They help plan the budget, identify the vendor, and approve the design and look of trophies.

<u>Media Committee:</u> If you enjoy creating graphics and event announcements, publishing website and social media posts, designing newsletters, or have photography and video skills, joining the Media Committee is a great way to get more involved at RHGC. This team is focused on sharing updates and news with our members, as well as promoting RHGC activities and the game of golf for all.

He gained a wealth of experience competing in many of the major amateur events, including the British Amateur, British Youths, British Boys, and the Peter MCavoy trophy-the eventual winner being world number one Lee Westwood.

On turning professional, Stuart was delighted to win 4th place while studying with the P.G.A among over 400 of his peers. Since achieving full membership, he has gained a wide range of experiences including two years in the U.S.A as a club fitter for Titleist and Cobra. He has also been part of the game improvement

center at the Open Golf Championship. With his continued interest in golf swing mechanics, he regularly attends seminars and classes and is now a certified Titleist TPI fitness and Junior and Golf Mechanics Coach.

From experience, his coaching philosophy is to Keep it Simple So Achievable! His aim is to help every golfer improve, thus extending their enjoyment in what is surely one of the greatest games. All his golf lessons incorporate GASP video technology, giving accurate feedback and can be scheduled early mornings, afternoons, and late evenings, every day except Friday. Simple Tips to Better Golf: the Grip

The correct hold on the golf club is essential in creating a repeatable, powerful and efficient hit. This is always demonstrated by professionals and elite amateurs.

For a right-handed golfer, position the handle from the start of the little finger of the left hand so it passes diagonally across the fingers. Avoid using the palms or life lines this will inhibit mobility.

The thumb of the left hand will rest on the top right side of the handle so $2\frac{1}{2}$ knuckles are visible.

The little finger of the right hand will overlap the first finger of the left, with the right thumb resting on the top left side of the handle. Grip pressure should be comfortable.



HANDICAP CORNER

Annual GHIN Reconciliation

Annually, based on our contract with our Allied Golf Association, we reconcile active members in GHIN Handicap System (GHIN) to our RHGC Master Membership Roster in Golf Genius, maintained by Membership Director. By February 28, 2023, Handicap Director will make "inactive" in GHIN any RHGC member who has not renewed and paid their RHGC membership. This is because on March 1st we are billed the full annual rate for the total number of golfers active in GHIN. So, if you are a member with a GHIN handicap index, and you haven't done so already, don't delay any further renewing your RHGC membership and paying your dues.

DID YOU KNOW?


The average number of ball marks made on greens per round is 8 per golfer. Assuming only 130 rounds are played each day on average on a course, greens receive 1,040, impressions daily which means 31,000 per month or more than 374,400 per year.


At Rolling Hills, we play up to 123 rounds per day. Are you wondering how to make a putt under these conditions or recently said to yourself, "How did that putt miss?".

REPAIR YOUR PITCHMARKS

When correctly repaired, a pitchmark will recover in <u>24 hours</u>. However, if left unrepaired for two hours or incorrectly repaired, it can take as long as <u>two months</u> to recover. Unrepaired pitchmarks are also breeding grounds for disease and infections.
