Please note the following changes for monthly medal tournaments as of June 18, 2023, as decided by the Tournament Committee:

Registration to open soon on golfgenius.com

- All Players: As done in recent Monthly Medal tournaments, handicaps will be reviewed before each tournament and adjusted by Tournament Committee, if needed, and communicated to the player(s). This to maintain the fairness of play to others and per the COP, "The Committee in charge of the Competition reserves the right to: Adjust the Playing Handicap of an entrant within the Terms of the Competition where there is evidence that the player's Handicap Index does not reflect their demonstrated ability. Any adjustments or reviews will be coordinated with the Handicap Committee." The adjustment is for each event only and does not affect your regular GHIN H.I.. (Note: these reviews/adjustments will also be done in non-monthly medal tournaments, as determined by the Tournament Committee.)
- **Monthly Medal Pairings**: Will be randomly selected by Golf Genius. Each threesome (or foursome) will have players from different flights dependent on the number of people registered and will be assigned a tee time by Golf Genius.
- Monthly Medal Scoring and Certifying of Scores: All Scoring will be via Golf Genius App utilizing the Digital Scorecard feature which requires that the Marker and Scorer verify the scores at the end of the Round and digitally sign the scorecards.
- All Monthly Medal Players <u>Must Report</u> to the Tournament Scoring Table within 15 minutes of completing the Round and having certified their scores: This is to validate the scores, assist with any discrepancies or problems, and to ensure that the scores have been properly recorded for the Monthly Medal Tournament in Golf Genius. Scores will then be marked electronically as checked and verified for the Monthly Medal Tournament, and will be considered final. The Monthly Medal Tournament Scoring Table <u>will close 15 minutes after the last group</u> has finished their round. <u>Players with incomplete scorecards at this time will be disqualified.</u>

HANDICAP CORNER

Rules of Handicapping 3.3: When a Hole is Started but Player Does Not Hole Out

There are various circumstances that might result in a player starting a hole but not holing out. For example, when:

- The result of the hole has already been decided,
- A hole has been conceded in match play,
- A player's partner has already posted a better score in a Four-Ball format and the player picks up, or
- A player has already reached their net double bogey limit on a specific hole.

When a player starts a hole but does not hole out for a valid reason, subject to other provisions set out within the Rules of Handicapping, the player must record their most likely score or net double bogey, whichever is lower, as appropriate for the situation and depending on the format of play.

<u>Most Likely Score:</u> The score a player records for handicap purposes for a hole that is started but where the player does not hole out. The most likely score is:

- The number of strokes already taken to reach a position on a hole, plus
- The number of strokes the player would most likely require to complete the hole from that position, plus
- Any penalty strokes incurred during play of the hole.

Most likely scores should be determined on any hole using the following guidelines:

Position of the Ball	Strokes to be Added	
If the ball lies on the putting green, and is no more than 5 feet (1.5 metres) from the hole:	Add one additional stroke.	
If the ball lies between 5 feet (1.5 metres) and 20 yards (20 metres) from the hole:	Add 2 or 3 additional strokes, depending on the position of the ball, the difficulty of the green and the ability of the player.	
If the ball lies more than 20 yards (20 metres) from the hole:	Add 3 or 4 additional strokes, depending on the position of the ball, the difficulty of the green and the ability of the player.	

(See Diagram 3.3.)

Rule 3.3 Interpretations:

3.3/1 - Clarification of the Meaning of Most Likely Score for Handicap Posting and When It Should Be Used

A *most likely score* is used to record a player's probable score on a hole, when the hole has been started but the player did not hole out their ball. It should be a reasonable assessment of the number of strokes needed to complete the hole.

For example, in a Four-Ball match-play competition, a player's partner holes their ball from off the putting green for three. The player's ball lies 15 feet (5 metres) away from the hole in four strokes and the score for the side cannot be improved. To save time, the player may pick up and record a *most likely score* for handicap purposes.

Based on the *most likely score* guidelines, the player would record a score of six or seven for handicap purposes (four strokes taken plus two or three additional strokes).




Important, Hole Not Played:

In general play (e.g., due to darkness or construction) or competition play where the player does not record a score (e.g., a match ends on the 15th hole), if the hole is not played, the score recorded for handicap purposes is net par, equal to par plus any handicap strokes the player is entitled to receive based on their Course Handicap. In either case (most likely score or hole not played), failure to complete or play the hole must not be for the purpose of gaining an unfair scoring advantage.




