# HANDICAP CORNER

If you play golf, you know this person. Maybe you're this person (maybe I'm that person?!). Regardless, when you are stuck on the golf course for four hours with your buddies or just some random players you got paired up with, you're bound to see some things. Frustration might boil over. Or maybe there's a simple lack of understanding regarding proper golf etiquette. Either way, it can get ugly. Or just really annoying.

That's why GOLF.COM asked you, loyal golfers, to vent, and posted a simple question: What's the most annoying thing you see golfers do? The comments section blew up (over 600 responses!). Some people spoke generally, listing generic things that irk them while on the course, while others seemed to talk (very) specifically about individual incidents that got under their skin.

Below we'll run through most of them - there were many repeats - for two important reasons: 1) you might learn something you do bothers other golfers; and 2) because it's kind of funny. (Note: They are not in any particular order and some have been edited for clarity)

- Leaving bag or cart on wrong side of the green, which slows down play
  Lingering to clean clubs or put headcovers back on when they have to go back to get it
- Taking a mulligan on every hole
- Collectively going to each person's shot as a group instead of playing ready golf
- Not repairing ball marks on the green
- · Slow play
- Spitting sunflower seeds on greens
- Having an excessive and slow pre-shot routine
- · Recording scores on greens instead of doing it on the next tee box
- Throwing clubs
- Handing out swing tips before you swing right after they hit a bad shot of their own
- Spending too long looking for golf balls
- Spending too long looking for golf balls in areas where hitting from would be impossible anyway
- Those who despise slow play yet play slowly themselves
- Needing help to find their golf ball on every single hole
- · When a twosome wants to play through a foursome with nowhere to go ahead of them
- Waiting for the green to clear when there's no chance they'd reach it anyway
- Poor attitudes
- Slowing up play by using rangefinders too often
- Not raking bunkers
- Driving carts too close to greens & tee boxes
- · Playing from the tips when it's obviously way too difficult or too far
- Kneeling on the greens
- Slow pre-shot routines that copy pros
- · Walking through a putting line on the green
- Talking in someone's backswing
- Spending a lot of time talking to cart girl
- Standing directly behind a player when they are hitting a tee shot
- Excessive practice swings
- Too many waggles
- Spending too much time reading two-foot putts like they are pros
- Chatting or lingering on the green when the hole is finished
- · Sitting on greens
- Recklessly gambling on the round
- · Spending too much time on tee boxes looking for usable tees to keep

- Leaving cigarettes or cigars on greens
- Leaving cigar ashes on greens
- Spending too much time digging in your golf bag looking for a second ball to hit
- Not getting ready to hit until it's their turn
- Playing honors off the tee when it's clearly slowing up the whole group
- Teeing off first on next tee box even though someone else made birdie
- Cheating
- Asking if a putt is good and can be conceded
- · Not using the restrooms on the course
- · Standing behind the hole when a player is putting
- Slowing down the group using AimPoint putting when they don't know how to use it
- Damaging the greens with their putters
- Using range balls on the golf course
- · Walking on the green with sandy shoes from the bunker
- Playing music too loudly
- Not asking other group members if it's OK to play music
- Unsolicited advice
- Talking to another player's golf ball
- Nonchalantly hitting short putts and counting them as made putts if missed
- Breaking clubs
- · Getting mad at bad shots they shouldn't have attempted in the first place
- People oblivious to letting other faster groups play through
- Moving while someone is putting
- · High-handicaps talking through every shot with caddie
- Retrieving the ball from the cup by using the head of a putter
- · Fixing ball marks on greens incorrectly
- · Leaving clubs on the greens
- Taking divots with practice swings
- Telling everyone how far they can hit the ball
- Playing well ahead of your group on the hole
- Raking putts from short distances
- · Leaving trash on the golf course
- Spending too much time lining up a shot putt for a quadruple bogey
- Putting driver and woods in the bottom section of the golf bag
- · Commentating on every shot like they are Jim Nantz

### **2023 Most Improved Players**

HIGHLIGHTS

Congratulations to our 2023 Most Improved Players! Historically each RHGC member has been eligible to win the Most Improved Player of the Year Award, which is part of the RHGC Tournament Policy. This is based on the player's December 1 official handicap index (HI) from the start of the season, compared against their season ending November official handicap index.

A player must be registered for the entire calendar year to qualify for this award. The calculation is done using the USGA GHIN handicap system's Most Improved Golfer Report, and validated by the Tournament Directors and Handicap Director. To support inclusivity and diversity, starting in 2023 the Board has approved expanding this award to three categories: adult Male, adult Female and Junior.

#### <u>Aramco Team Series</u> Riyadh Golf Club – Pro-Am






# **Aramco** Invitational tournament

### **Safety Tip - Cart Sheds**

It is important to remember to drive a golf cart safely in all locations. Specifically, we ask that you remember that the cart shed areas (upper and lower) are busy with pedestrians and carts at all times the course is open. Please drive slowly and carefully, and anticipate that you will encounter others. Please do not cut corners and please keep to the right, particularly at junctions at the end of each row of sheds.

In addition to reminding drivers to be aware and drive carefully, the Board has made a



request with Community Services to install mirrors at the end of each row to increase visibility and help keep the course safe.


### JUNIOR TOUR SCHOOL

Please supply a paragraph about yourself, and include the qualities you have that will support your application. As per the Recreation Manual, to be considered for one of the above Director positions, applicants must:

- Be a RHGC member
- Be an Aramco employee or a spouse of an Aramco employee
- Work in Dhahran, or have a mailbox located in Dhahran
- Not serve simultaneously on two self-directed groups

### 2024 Membership Renewal

2024 Membership Renewal forms have now gone out to all primary members' personal email addresses that you have registered with RHGC. Attached in the emails are forms that are prefilled with your membership information. If you have not received an email, please first check your SPAM/Junk folder, then please contact the RHGC Membership Director at <u>RHGCMemberships@gmail.com</u> with your membership number to have them resent to you.

Note: The Proshop <u>will not</u> have copies of your forms, please ensure you bring two copies with you for renewal.

The Proshop will begin accepting renewals on Monday December 4, 2023. Regular Proshop hours are: Monday to Thursday: 11 am to 6 pm, Friday and Saturday: 6 am to 12 pm, Sundays: Closed.

The deadline for renewals without penalty is January 31, 2024. Renewals made on February 1, 2024 to February 29, 2024 will be subject to a 250 SAR late fee. Renewals from March 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024 will be treated as a new membership application and will be subject to the 500 SAR initiation fee. You will also lose your place on the cart shed waiting list.

Cart shed holders must renew by January 31, 2024. Failure to renew your membership will result in your cart shed being reassigned to the next member on the cart shed waiting list. Cart shed tenants are required to have paid for yearly green fees through Recreation for the calendar year.





The 2023 - 2024 Race to Georgia started last month in Saudi Arabia with a strong pool of 85 players competing for honours at the at Dirab Golf Club. This is the first of 13 qualifying rounds for this popular season long series of events held in Bahrain, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the UAE, which attracted over 1,500 golfers last season.

The qualifying rounds are open to all amateur golfers; men, women, as well as a junior division, with a maximum handicap allowance of 24 for men and 36 for women.

All events will be played in a Stableford format with 75 percent of registered handicaps, with sanctioning from the respective official golfing authorities; Saudi Arabian Golf Federation, Bahrain Golf Association and Emirates Golf Federation.

The RHGC qualifying even twill take place on **February 3**, **2023 at Rolling Hills Golf Course** in Dhahran. More details will follow in the coming months.

From each qualifying event, the category winners and runners-up will qualify to attend the Regional Finals to be held in Dubai at the Montgomerie Golf Club (for UAE qualifiers) on Sunday March 3, 2024, and at the Riyadh Golf Club (for KSA, Bahrain and Qatar qualifiers) on Saturday, March 9,2024.

The ultimate winners of the finals will win an all-expenses trip to the World Final of the Race to Georgia to be held during The Masters week. Part of the prize is a two-day visit to attend The Masters week as a patron.

Keith Watson, the Tournament Series Organiser on behalf of REZA Hygiene, said: "We are all very excited with the growth and interest in this tournament with the 'Bucket List' trip to the US World Final and a visit to The Masters. We thank all the participating golf clubs and golfers for their support – many of whom are traditional regulars of the Race to Georgia. Due to the growing interest and awareness of the Race to Georgia, the series has been expanded this season to include Qatar, at Doha Golf Club."

The series is powered by REZA Hygiene, a leading hygiene solution provider throughout the GCC, whose core mission with their Race to Georgia initiative remains the same; to help promote golf's growth in the region, especially in line with Saudi Arabia's Vision 2030.
