

# OPENING DAY TOURNAMENT

January 20, 2024

#### **FORMAT**

This will be a four-person team event (ABCD), Lone Ranger format where, on each hole, 1 player of the team will be playing by themselves, while the remaining 3 players will be playing a 3-person Shamble. This means all 3 players tee off, then the 3 players select the best drive they want to use, and all 3 players then play their own ball from the drive until holed. The best score from the 3 Shamble players, plus the score from the lone player will count as the combined score for the team for the hole. Three drives per player are required within the Shamble format. The drive of the lone player playing their own ball does not count towards the minimum drive count within the Shamble group.

Tee times will be Shotgun at 6:30am and Shotgun at 11am. Registration is open here.

The USGA and The R&A announced the following updates to the World Handicap System™ (WHS™) as part of an ongoing review of the Rules of Handicapping™ and Course Rating System™ with a continued emphasis on accuracy, consistency and equity. The latest revisions will go into effect beginning January 1, 2024. Significant updates to the WHS include:

# 9-HOLE SCORES

No more waiting on 9-hole scores to combine, as they will count toward your Handicap Index the very next day. A premium is placed on the holes you played and combined with an expected Score Differential for consistency and fairness.



# A new treatment of 9-hole scores

Today, 9-hole scores are combined in the order posted to create an 18-hole Score Differential™. This means that a 9-hole score shot today could be combined with a 9-hole score from days, weeks, or even months before – which can lead to volatile results.

Beginning in 2024, when a player posts a 9-hole score, it will be combined with their expected Score Differential over 9 holes to create an 18-hole Score Differential for immediate use – with expected score based on the player's Handicap Index at the time the round is played as well as a course of standard difficulty.

# 10-17-HOLE SCORES Use of expected Score Differential applies when 10-17 holes are played, introducing more flexibility to score posting. In this scenano, you re asked to post your score hole-by hole.

# An updated approach for holes not played

At present when a hole isn't played (due to darkness, for example), the score recorded is a net par. When the 2024 revision goes into effect, when 10-17 holes are played, an 18-hole Score Differential will be determined by adding the player's Score Differential from the holes played to an expected Score Differential for the number of holes not played.

Since a player's expected score is not specific to a course or reliant upon the course's stroke index allocation (as net par is today), this will lead to more consistency.

# **COURSE RATING & SHORTER COURSES**

Courses as short as 750 yards for 9 holes and 1,500 yards for 18 holes are eligible for a Course Rating" and Slope Rating" – enhancing the portability of a Handicap Index" to make the system more accommodating



### A lower minimum length for a golf course to obtain a Course Rating™ and Slope Rating™

Under the current system, an 18-hole course must be at least 3,000 yards to receive a Course Rating and Slope Rating (or 1,500 yards for 9 holes). Starting in 2024, the yardage requirements will be cut in half, to 1,500 and 750 yards, respectively.

This is good news for golfers who regularly play par-3 and shorter-length courses and have wanted those scores to count toward their Handicap Index®.


#### **JUNIOR** TOUR SCHOOL

The ultimate winners of the finals will win an all-expenses trip to the World Final of the Race to Georgia to be held during The Masters week. Part of the prize is a two-day visit to attend The Masters week as a patron.
