# HANDICAP CORNER

Rolling Hills Golf Club uses the World Handicap System (WHS). For the benefit of the club membership below is a refresher of some key rules affecting how Handicap's are determined.

### **Handicap Index (HI)**

Based on the lowest 8 of the most recent 20 score differentials. Updated daily, if a new score is posted.

### What are acceptable scores

- Stroke play or match play (home or away)
- 9-hole or 18-hole rounds
- 9-hole score does not neeed to be paired. GHIN calculates a full 18hole handicap differential directly from a single 9-hole round
- Competition or causal play
- Partially played rounds, differential is calculated based on expected scores for
- the missing holes.

## Maximum Hole Score (Net Double Bogey Rule)

For handicap purposes:

 Max Score = Par + 2 + Handicap Strokes Received on the Hole





# What is an exceptional score reduction (ESR)

Post a very low score (7.0+ or 10.0+ below HI), GHIN automatically applies a HI reduction by:

- 1.0 stroke for a score 7.0–9.9 below HI
- 2.0 strokes for a score 10.0+ below HI

### What are Soft and Hard Caps

Prevents big changes in handicap due to sudden score fluctuations:

- Soft Cap: Applies if your new calculated index (based on best 8 of last 20 scores) is 3.0 strokes above your Low Handicap Index (LHI)
  - Any HI increase beyond 3.0 strokes is reduced by 50%
- Hard Cap: Sets a maximum limit on how much your HI can increase.
  - HI can't increase more than
     5.0 strokes above your LHI regardless of your scores

# **FUN FACTS**

Ever wonder why we shout "Fore!" or celebrate a "Birdie?"

Golf's unique vocabulary is steeped in history, adding a rich layer to the game we love. Let's tee up some fascinating origins for our newsletter!

Tee: More Than Just a Peg
Before wooden or plastic pegs,
golfers in the 17th century used
"teaz"—small heaps of sand—to
elevate their balls. This practical
innovation prevented damage to
expensive balls and clubs. The
word "tee" is a direct descendant of
this early Scottish practice.

### Fore!: A Call from the Past

The term "fore" in golf is most likely derived from the historical role of the "forecaddie," a person who would scout ahead to locate golf balls. When a ball was heading towards the forecaddie, golfers would shout "forecaddie" as a warning. Over time, this term was shortened to "fore" for simplicity and ease of use during the game.

While the military theory suggests a possible influence from the use of "before" as a warning, the direct connection to golf's specific terminology and practices makes the "forecaddie" origin more plausible. Historical golf literature and the evolution of golf terminology support this explanation, indicating that "fore" is a natural progression from "forecaddie."

### Birdie: A "Bird of a Shot!"

Hitting one under par is a "Birdie," a term born in America around 1903. Legend has it a golfer at Atlantic City Country Club hit an exceptionally good shot, exclaiming it was "a bird of a shot!" When he then sank the putt for one under, the group adopted "birdie" for such a stellar score.

Bogey: Battling the "Bogey Man"
Scoring one over par is a "Bogey," a
term with British roots from the late
1800s. It's thought to come from "the
Bogey Man" of a popular music hall
song. Golfers at the time would
jokingly refer to the ideal score for a
hole as "the Bogey Man" – a target
difficult to "catch." As "par" became
the standard for expert play, "bogey"
settled in as one stroke over that
mark.

"Par," the expected number of strokes for a hole or course, comes from the Latin word meaning "equal." Its use in golf likely draws from its financial meaning of a standard or expected value. The concept of a standard score for a hole formalized in the late 19th century, with "par" officially adopted by the USGA in 1911 as the

score an expert player would achieve under normal conditions.

These terms are more than just golf jargon; they're echoes of the game's past, connecting us to centuries of tradition and the stories behind every swing. So next time you're on the course, remember the rich history behind every "Fore!" and every "Birdie!"
