CONDITIONS OF PLAY

Format

The tournament will use a team "Texas" scramble format, with each team made up of four players. Teams are organized into four flights according to their combined handicaps. The team handicap is calculated as 10% of the total of each player's playing handicaps (for example, a combined total of 52 gives a team handicap of 5.2). The highest handicap allowed is 26 for men and 32 for women. Men play from white tees, and women from red tees. 3 Drive minimum per player (must be noted on scorecard)

Every player tees off, and the team selects their best shot. All team members then play their next shot from this location, making sure to place the ball within one club length and not closer to the hole, and on the same surface type (such as rough or hazard) as the original shot. This continues until the ball is holed. Each player must contribute at least three drives during the round.

If a team arrives incomplete on tournament day, organizers may appoint a replacement player. The team's handicap will only be adjusted if the new handicap is lower than the original. Regardless, teams will stay in their assigned flight.

Three Player Team Rule

If a team consists of only three players, the members will rotate as the "fourth" player for each hole. Every member, including the rotating fourth, must provide at least three drives. The designated fourth player for a hole must perform all duties for that hole and may need to play twice if required. The missing player's handicap is calculated by averaging the three players' handicaps, and the team handicap is adjusted accordingly. Players are not allowed to substitute between morning and afternoon teams.

Mulligans (Free Shots)

Each team can purchase one mulligan per player for 400 SAR, unless they are part of a Platinum or Gold sponsored team, in which case mulligans are included in the entry fee. A mulligan grants an additional shot at any point during the round, but only one is allowed per player. Mulligans must be declared and played from the preferred shot, and once the mulligan ball is hit, the original is out of play. Maximum of 1 mulligan per player and 4 per team (mulligans are not transferable to another team member). The exception is if your team wins extra mulligan(s) during the Captain's Scramble.

Captain's Advantage

Teams participating in the "Captain's Scramble" on October 23rd will be awarded advantages to utilize during the event. These advantages are determined by each team's performance in the Captain's Scramble. Available benefits include options such as playing from a forward tee box, receiving additional team mulligans, utilizing Hazard Wildcards, or earning a gimme putt or even lowering drive minimums.

No Hard Spikes & Dress Code

Hard spikes are not allowed at Rolling Hills Golf Club. Players can use showers and lockers but must bring their own towels. Collared shirts are required, and tee shirts, sleeveless shirts, cutoff shorts, and jeans are not permitted.

Score Cards

Scores must be entered using the Golf Genius App via the Digital Scorecard feature. Each team will receive a GGID to access their scorecard, with instructional videos available. If no team member can enter scores digitally, the lowest handicap golfer must keep and sign a paper scorecard, which must be submitted to the scoring table within 30 minutes after play ends. Late scorecard submission leads to disqualification. A paper scorecard will be provided to track drives and back-up for score accuracy.

Pace of Play

Teams are expected to keep up with the group in front of them and complete their round in four hours, with a maximum limit of 4½ hours. The lowest handicap golfer is responsible for maintaining the team's pace. No more than one minute should be spent searching for lost balls. Marshals will monitor play; teams more than one hole behind will be asked to speed up. Continued delays may result in a three-over-par penalty for the next hole.

If morning teams exceed 4½ hours, they may be asked to leave the course and take par for unfinished holes. If multiple teams cannot finish, organizers may assign par or use the average score from teams that finished the hole.

Prizes

Trophies and vouchers will be presented to the top three teams in each flight, as well as to the overall tournament champions, whose names will be inscribed on the Oilman's Golf Tournament Trophy. The team with the lowest overall net score will be recognized as the Tournament Champions, and the runner-up in the same flight as the Overall Champions will be awarded the flight winner title. For example, if the low net team belongs to the B Flight, they will receive the Overall Champion designation, and the B Flight runner-up will be promoted to B Flight winner status. Second and third place trophies and prizes will be given to the respective runners-up.

Skill prizes are available on every hole, including awards for closest to the pin, longest drive, most accurate drive, and the Chairperson's Drive flag. Additionally, a chipping contest will take place near the clubhouse, offering attractive prizes to the winner. Notable prizes include Titleist drivers, Scotty Cameron putters, vouchers, and golf balls.

Awards Dinner

After the tournament, an awards dinner will be held on October 24th at Ad Diwan, approximately 500 meters from the clubhouse. Doors open at 6:30pm with the festivities beginning at 7:00pm. The dinner is casual, with recognition for flight and skill prize winners, sponsor acknowledgments, and prize distribution. Announcements will be kept brief so that participants can enjoy the meal and celebration.
