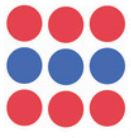

No Par 3 Contest winner has ever won the Masters in the same year. That's the contest's most famous tradition, and it has become one of Augusta's best-known superstitions.

The very first Par 3 Contest was won by Sam Snead in 1960. So this event has been part of Masters week for more than six decades.

It's known as one of the most relaxed and family-centered moments of the week.

Players often let spouses, children, and grandchildren caddie for them, which gives the event its warm, playful feel.

There have been 100 holes-in-one in Par 3 Contest history as counted by Masters coverage through 2023.

That helps explain why fans love it so much—it produces a lot of memorable moments in a short time.

1991 The War on the Shore

Kiawah Island delivered on one of the fiercest Ryder Cups ever played. With tension at its peak, the decisive moment came when Bernhard Langer missed the putt that allowed the Americans to keep the Cup in one of the competition's most pressure-filled finishes.

1999 The Battle of Brookline

The U.S. produced a stunning singles comeback from four points down, turning Brookline into one of the loudest and most unforgettable scenes in Ryder Cup history. Justin Leonard's huge putt became the symbol of an American fightback still talked about today.

TEAM EUROPE

1987 Europe breaks through in America

At Muirfield Village, Team Europe claimed its first-ever Ryder Cup win on U.S. soil - a landmark moment that changed the balance of power in the event. It was more than a victory, it was the moment Europe proved it could travel, compete and win under pressure.

2012 The Miracle of Medinah

Few moments in Ryder Cup history match the drama of Medinah. Europe stormed back from a huge final-day deficit, and Martin Kaymer held his nerve on the 18th to beat Steve Stricker and seal one of the most famous comebacks the game has ever seen.
